Our National Anthem

The Grand Island High School Music Department has a tradition of beginning each concert with the National Anthem. The purpose of starting public events with the Star Spangled Banner is to offer ALL present the opportunity to pay tribute to those who have sacrificed in order to maintain our national ideals. In order to properly pay tribute, audience members are asked to stand and face the flag. Hats should be removed and all are encouraged to participate in singing. A hand over the heart is also an appropriate sign of respect.

Concert Etiquette

As the Anthem concludes, applauding is not necessary and is actually rather inappropriate as it reflects the performance of the ensemble on stage and not the tribute to the nation for which the performance was intended.

Our role on stage is to offer an arrangement free of embellishments and fanfares that could distract audiences and which might discourage participation. We thank you for your cooperation and hope that you will eagerly participate in the singing of the National Anthem.

Please help to make tonight and all concerts an enjoyable experience by:

- Remaining seated during musical selections
- Enter and exit the auditorium only when absolutely necessary and do so between groups
- Refrain from making noise or talking as any noise is distracting to the other audience members
- Applaud after the entire piece is complete not in between movements
- Turn off electronic devices and give **full** attention to the performers on stage.
